General: Based on review of documentation, three (3) caregivers hired on 7/1/16, 1/1/90, and 5/10/10, each completed eleven (11) hours of training during a subsequent year of employment. Two (2) caregivers hired on 6/1/09 and 8/8/00, each completed twelve (12) hours of training during a subsequent year of employment. A caregiver hired on 7/20/14, completed fourteen (14) hours of training during a subsequent year of employment.

A child enrolled on 6/2/21, did not have information on file for staff to contact the child's physician.
