Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the child care center failed to comply with regulations regarding supervison. Observation in the preshool room revealed a three year old child was accompanied by a Oldham County High School student walking out of the classroom down the hall to the bathroom alone with no other qualifed staff member. Interview with the director revealed the Oldham County High School student is a volunteer in the child care center, and no background checks were available for review.

750 - Playground Conditions Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (20) An outdoor play area shall be:
- (d) Safe from foreseeable hazard;
- (e) Well drained;
- (f) Well maintained;
- (g) In good repair; and
- (h) Visible to staff at all times.

Findings:

815 - Toys/Furniture

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with regulations regarding outdoor play. Observation of the playground revealed a wood post under the shaded area that was wrapped in a foam pool noodle, the foam had several pieces broken off and peeling away from it. Further observation revealed four (4) one and two year old children playing on the outdoor play area.

Equipment Not In Compliance

- (1) All toys and furniture contacted by a child shall be:
- (a) Kept clean and in good repair; and
- (b) Free of peeling, flaking, or chalking paint.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with regulations regarding equipment. In the infant room, there were several areas of paint chipping away from a wooden rocking chair.

(c) Daily attendance records documenting the arrival and departure time of each child, including records that are required in accordance with 922 KAR 2:160, Section 13, if a child receives services from the child-care center through the Child Care Assistance Program;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to comply with regulations regarding written documentation. Review of the attendance records and interview with the director revealed not all twenty-five (25) children present during time of survey were signed into the daily attendance records; only twenty-one (21) were signed into the daily attendance record for that day.

1190 - Orientation Procedure Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 2. Child Care Services.

(3)(b) The program shall include:

2. Written policy that specifies that the procedures that were taught at the orientation training shall be implemented by each child-care center staff member.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to comply with regulations regarding written documentation. There was no written orientation policy that indicated staff will implement procedures that were taught during orientation training.

Interview with the director revealed the requested documentation was unavailable at the time of survey.
