- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child care program;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 1/13/21, had not completed the orientation training.

General: Based on observation, a can of Gillette Foamy Shave Foam was on a shelf, accessible to the children in the older three-year-old children's room. The can had a label that stated, "To Keep out of Reach of Children." The shaving cream was not in use.

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

General: Based on observation, the carpet had dark black stains in the "middle" room.

General: Based on observation, a yellow/blue slide was placed on artificial grass turf in the older children's outdoor play area. A blue slide and a red/blue slide were placed on artificial grass turf in the younger children's outdoor play area. The equipment did not have protective surface material underneath.

- 2. A firm crib mattress in good repair with a clean tight-fitted sheet that shall be changed:
- a. Weekly; or
- b. Immediately if it is soiled or wet;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a crib mattress had an eight (8) inch long tear, along the seam, in the infants' room.

820 - Indoor/Outdoor Equipment

922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings.

- (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall:
- (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair;
- (b) Meet the physical, developmental needs, and interests of children of different age groups;
- (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and
- (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the Plexiglas, on three (3) cribs, had dried smears in the infants' room. A screw was missing from the base of a crib which caused the base to hang on the crib in the one-year-old's room. A ceiling vent had an accumulation of dust located in the "middle" room.

General: Based on review of documentation, the fire drills did not include the time each drill was conducted on 7/27/20, 8/18/20, 9/24/20, 10/10/20, 11/2/20, 1/25/21, 2/5/21, 3/31/21, and 4/26/21. The tornado and earthquake drills did not include the time each drill was conducted during the third quarter of 2020 and first quarter of 2021.

Also, a caregiver hired on 1/11/21, did not have a processed name-based criminal records check available for review in accordance with 922 KAR 2:415E Section 11(5)..
