General: Based on Review of Documentation, the planned program of activities was not posted in the older school-age children's room.

- (7) Except in accordance with subsection (8) of this section, the following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:
- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
- (b) Knives and sharp objects;
- (c) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids;
- (d) Plastic bags;
- (e) Litter and rubbish;
- (f) Bar soap; and
- (g) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, three (3) caregivers' coats hung on the back of a door and a caregiver's cell phone was on a child-size table in preschool room #1. An empty top seal bag and two (2) small rolls of trash bags were stored in an unlocked cabinet in the older school-age children's room. A bottle of Clean Force oxygen bleach cleaner was stored in an unlocked cabinet in the boys' restroom. Two (2) empty wadded up plastic bags were stored in an unlocked compartment under the sink in the younger school-age children's room. An empty wadded up plastic bag was stored in an unlocked compartment under the sink in preschool room #3. A caregiver's coat hung on the wall behind the door in preschool room #4. All of these items were accessible to children.

520 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, a two (2) foot section of the textured ceiling peeled away in the boys' restroom.

585 - Sink Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (3) A sink shall be:
- (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;
- (c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;
- (d) Equipped with liquid soap;
- (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;
- (f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and
- (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, the hot water temperature registered sixty-two (62) degrees Fahrenheit at two (2) sinks in the girls' restroom and at two (2) sinks in the boys' restroom and at the sink in preschool room #1, preschool room #2, and preschool room #3.
