General: Based on interview, the surveyor found that a staff (DOH: 06/13/22) lived in the state of Indiana in the last five (5) years. The staff's file did not contain a completed out of state Child Abuse/Neglect Background Check. The staff's file contained a completed Criminal Records Background Check for the state of Indiana dated 06/13/22. During interview, staff-in-charge stated that the staff person has not worked alone with children. The surveyor did not observe the staff person working alone with children. Staff-in-charge stated that she could find no other links on the website for a CAN check and that she would submit the out of state Child Abuse/Neglect Background Check for the staff person. Based on review of the Kentucky National Background Check Service, the staff person had a completed background check dated 06/13/22.

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found that the lighting was not adequate light at nap time to view children as they sleep in the Preschool Classroom; therefore, staff did not adequately have the children within scope of vision. The surveyor observed the staff-in-charge to inform the staff person inside the classroom to turn on a light to be able to see

922 KAR 2:090. Section 13. Reports.

- (1) The following shall be reported to the cabinet or designee and other agencies specified in this section within twenty-four (24) hours from the time of discovery:
- (a) Communicable disease, which shall also be reported to the local health department pursuant to KRS 214.010;
- (b) An accident or injury to a child that requires medical care initiated by the child-care center or the child's parent;
- (c) An incident that results in legal action by or against the child-care center that:
- 1. Affects a child or staff person; or
- 2. Includes the center's discontinuation or disqualification from a governmental assistance program due to fraud, abuse, or criminal conviction related to that program;
- (d) An incident involving fire or other emergency, including a vehicular accident when the center is transporting a child receiving child care services;
- (e) A report of child abuse or neglect that:
- 1. Has been accepted by the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 1:330; and
- 2. Names a director, employee, volunteer, or person with supervisory or disciplinary control over, or having unsupervised contact with, a child in care as the alleged perpetrator; or
- (f) An individual specified in Section 6(4) of this administrative regulation meeting a disqualifying criterion or background check result pursuant to 922 KAR 2:280.

Findings:

General: Based on interview, the surveyor found that an incident of suspected abuse/neglect involving a four-year-old child and a staff person that occurred in approximately April of 2022 inside a closet in the Preschool Classroom was not reported to the cabinet by the child-care center; therefore, the incident was not reported to the cabinet within twenty-four (24) hours from the time of discovery. Based on interview, the surveyor learned that video footage was pulled in regards to the incident; however, the child-care center did not have video footage of inside the closet where the alleged incident took place. Staff reported that when reviewing the video footage, the four-year-old child was seen standing at the edge of the closet and appeared to be fine. Staff reported that a check of the child revealed no marks or bruises.
