- (a) Suitable for the purpose intended;
- (b) Kept clean and in good repair;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. The first sink in the girls' restroom located beside the Gym was covered with a black plastic garbage bag; therefore, the sink was not kept in good repair. During interview, staff-incharge stated that the sink had not been in use for approximately one (1) year.
- 2. The handle to the faucet on the first sink in the boys' restroom located beside the Gym was observed to come off when the surveyor pulled on it to turn the water on; therefore, the faucet was not kept in good repair. During interview, staff-in-charge stated that she was not aware that the handle was loose on the faucet.
- 3. The handle to the faucet on the second sink was observed to be missing; therefore, the faucet was not kept in good repair.

- 3. The toilet seat moved easily and was not tightly secured to the toilet in the first stall in the boys' restroom located beside the Gym.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. The following children's (DOE: 08/23/21 and 10/14/19) files did not contain the contact telephone number for the child's preferred hospital.
- 2. A child's (DOE: 03/17/21) file did not contain authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence.
