General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that the permission to administer medication form dated 8-22-16 for the gas drops in the Infant classroom did not include a time for the drops to be given. The administration record for the drops indicated that they were administered twice that day.

General: Based on Observation, it was found that the medication box in the Infant classroom contained an inhaler, a bottle of gas drops and a tube of butt paste. None of these containers were labeled with a child's name.

It was also found that the two and three-year-old children in the Toddler classroom were served 2% milk with their cereal. The staff in the classroom stated that the 2% milk is given to the children to drink when the school does not provide the milk.
