Findings:

General: Based on observation, the school playground is not fenced as required for the safety of the children. During interviews, it was confirmed that this playground is used by the pre-school aged children.

(20) An outdoor play area shall be:

- (d) Safe from foreseeable hazard;
- (e) Well drained;
- (f) Well maintained;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the school playground was not in good condition as broken equipment (two (2) overturned basketball goals, two (2) tricycles) were lying on the concrete slab. During an interview with the director, it was confirmed that this playground is sometimes used by the preschool-age children.

695 - Protective Surface Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (21) A protective surface shall:
- (a) Be provided for outdoor play equipment used to:
- 1. Climb;
- 2. Swing; and
- 3. Slide; and
- (b) Have a fall zone equal to the height of the equipment.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the following was found:

- 1) Four (4) slides extend from the large dinosaur play structure; however, there is no protective surfacing.
- 2) Eight (8) swings have no protective surfacing. During an interview with the director, it was confirmed that this playground is sometimes used by the preschool-age children.

Equipment

710 - Play Equipment In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (24) Supports for climbing apparatus and large equipment shall be securely fastened to the ground.
- (25) Crawl spaces, such as tunnels, shall be short and wide enough to permit access by adults.

- (b) Covered when not in use;
- (c) Kept clean; and
- (d) Checked for vermin prior to use.

- (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and
- (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the following was found:

- 1) Although the McDonald's play equipment area was deemed unsafe for use by the child care center children, the gate to this fenced lot was open while the surveyor was present for this investigation. During an interview with the director, she stated that this equipment is never used and proposed that the gate must of been left open by the volunteers who mowed the property on the morning of 05/20/15.
- 2) On the school playground, the large silver slide which was deemed unsafe for use by the child care center was not blocked to prevent a child from climbing the steps and sliding.
