General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation, surveyor observed voluneers present at the center. Documentation revealed "All employees, practicum students, and volunteers are required to have an annual TB screening. Verification of the annual TB screening (Form A040) will be maintained in a file separate from personnel files." Interview and review of documentation confirmed a practicum student, start date 09/05/17, and a volunteer start date 03/04/08, did not have a TB skin test or physician statement on file. A volunteer, start date 06/25/08, had a TB skin test dated 04/22/13, and a volunteer, start date 06/30/09, had a TB skin test dated 08/16/12.
