General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulations. Review of staff files revealed one (1) staff member hired 9/17/18 failed to have record of negative tuberculin result on file. Interview with director revealed this documentation was not on file at the time of survey.

410 - Training

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

(16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following: (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½)

hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 1/2) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulations. Review of staff files and ECE-TRIS report revealed one (1) staff member with a hire date of 9/17/18 had not completed state approved orientation training. Interview with director revealed this documentation was not on file at the time of survey.

Review of children's files on 3/11/19 revealed the immunization certificate presented for review at the time of survey for a child enrolled 5/29/18 was no longer current as of 7/15/18. Interview with director revealed she needed to obtain a current immunization certificate for the aforementioned child.
