265 - Health, Safety, Comfort 922 KAR 2:110. Section 4. Director Requirements and Responsibilities.

- (1) Effective with the adoption of this administrative regulation, a director shall:
- (I) Provide for the health, safety, and comfort of each child;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor observed a large area rug that had been rolled up and stored in the back of the classroom next to the exit door and near a play space in Classroom #2. The rug was over five (5) feet tall and positioned in an upright position near the block area. The staff person stated that the rug had been in that position for a few days and that the rug was going to be thrown in the garbage. The surveyor observed three (3) toddlers present in the classroom. The toddlers were observed walking around the classroom. The rug stored in this manner poses a safety concern because it was accessible to the chidren.

275 - Caregiver Alone **Not In Compliance**

922 KAR 2:110. Section 4. Director Requirements and Responsibilities.

- (1) Effective with the adoption of this administrative regulation, a director shall:
- (n) Assure that a person acting as a caregiver of a child in care shall not be left alone with a child, if the licensee has not received the results of the background checks as described in Section 3(1)(e)6 of this administrative regulation;

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, a staff person hired in February 2016 did not have an out-of-state background check on file. The staff person stated that she moved to Kentucky in January 2016. The surveyor observed the staff person working alone in Classroom #6 with nine (9) four (4) year old children. The staff person stated that she has primarily worked by herself ever since she started working for the facility.

922 KAR 2:090. Section 6. License Issuance.

- (5) An individual described in subsection (4) of this section shall: (a) Submit to background checks described in paragraph (b) of this subsection;
- (b) May be employed or work with a child on a probationary basis for up to ninety (90) calendar days, pending completion of a:
- 1. Child abuse or neglect check using the central registry in accordance with 922 KAR 1:470;
- 2. Criminal records check required by KRS 199.896(19);
- 3. Criminal records check for any previous state of residence if the person resided outside the state of Kentucky in the last five (5) years; and
- 4. An address check of the Sex Offender Registry; and
- (c) Not be left alone in the presence of a child until copies of the background checks in accordance with paragraph (b) of this subsection have been received by the licensee.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the following was found: 1) Record review found that an employee hired on 2/11/16 has lived in Louisiana and Texas within the last five (5) years. The staff person in charge stated that she has not submitted out-of-state background checks for this employee. This staff person was observed working alone with children during the visit. 2) Record review found that an employee hired on 8/1/16 has lived in Florida within the last five (5) years. The staff person in charge stated that she has not submitted a Florida background check for this employee. 3) Record review found that an employee hired on 6/20/16 has lived in Connecticut within the last five (5) years. The staff person in charge stated that she has not submitted a Connecticut background check for this employee. 4) One (1) staff person (hire date: 12/14/15) had a criminal records check (CRC) that was dated 12/21/15. There was no documentation to verify that the CRC was submitted within the required time frame.

5) One (1) staff person (hire date: 3/17/16) had a CRC that was submitted on 3/21/16; therefore, it was not submitted within the required time frame, 6) One (1) staff person (hire date: 6/16/16) had a CRC that was submitted on 6/21/16; therefore, it was not submitted within the required time frame. 7) One (1) staff person (hire date: 8/1/16) had a CRC that was submitted on 8/9/16; therefore, it was not submitted within the required time frame.

320 - TB Verification **Not In Compliance**

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, the following was found: 1) Two (2) staff files (hire dates: 8/2/11 and 8/14/08) contained results of negative T.B. tests that are no longer current. The tests were dated 8/1/14 and 9/26/14 which exceeds the two (2) year time frame. 2) Two (2) staff did not have evidence of a negative TB skin test or physician's statement documenting he/she was free from tuberculosis prior to employment. One (1) staff person was hired on 6/20/16; however, did not have a TB skin test until 6/30/16. The other staff person was hired on 6/18/16; however, did not have a TB skin test until 6/28/16.

340 - Training **Not In Compliance**

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 1/2) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, the following was found: 1) One (1) staff file (hire date: 6/18/16) did not contain evidence of the six (6) hours of cabinet-approved training being completed within the first three (3) months of employment. 2) One (1) staff file (hire date: 12/5/11) did not contain the required fifteen (15) hours of training. The surveyor reviewed the Early Care and Education Training Records Information System (ECE-TRIS) website and the staff person's personnel file at the facility and found no evidence that this training had been completed.

General: Based on Observation, a quart of Satin Enamel Paint was observed on top of the children's cubbies in Classroom #8. The paint was within reach of a couple of four (4) year old children that were present in the classroom.

General: Based on Observation, the surveyor found that there was not a CPR mouthpiece or a thermometer available on the 2016 Ford bus.

Food Service 960 - Bottles **Not In Compliance**

922 KAR 2:120. Section 8. Kitchen Requirements.

- (9) Bottles shall be:
- (a) Individually labeled;
- (b) Promptly refrigerated;
- (c) Covered when not in use; and
- (d) Consumed within one (1) hour of being heated or removed from the refrigerator.

General: Based on Observation, the surveyor observed two (2) bottles in the refrigerator located in Classroom #2 that were not covered.

985 - Milk Requirements **Not In Compliance**

922 KAR 2:120. Section 9. Food and Meal Requirements.

- (3) A serving of milk shall consist of:
- (a) Breast milk or iron-fortified formula for a child age birth to twelve (12) months;
- (b) Pasteurized whole milk for children ages twelve (12) months to twenty-four (24) months; or
- (c) Pasteurized low fat one (1) percent or fat-free skim milk for children ages twenty-four (24) months to school-age.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, the surveyor observed several gallons of 1% milk in the refrigerator, but did not observe any gallons of Vitamin D whole milk for children twelve (12) months to twenty- four (24) months. The Director indicated that she was unaware that whole milk needed to be available or served to children under two (2) years old.

Findings

General: Based on Review of Documentation, the following was found: 1. Three (3) children (enrollment dates: 8/20/15, 1/4/16 and 10/26/15) had an immunization certificate on file that was no longer current as of 3/9/16, 6/30/16 and 9/16/16. 2. A review of two (2) children's files (enrollment dates: 8/12/15 and 3/12/15) found that they did not contain an immunization certificate.
