Findings: General: Based on interview and review of documentation, a four-year-old child pulled diaper wipes from a container on 9/29/2020. Interview determined a caregiver pulled the hair on the back of the child's head to make the child stop pulling wipes from the container. The center's discipline policy stated, "At Wee People, we view discipline not as a means of punishing a child who has acted inappropriately, but rather as a means of teaching a child. Positive discipline teaches children where the limits are set, how to maintain control over their bodies and how to problem solve in the event of conflict." Therefore, the center's policy was not met when a caregiver pulled the child's hair to make him stop pulling wipes from a container on 9/29/2020.
