General: Based on review of documentation, two (2) caregivers hired on 2/11/22 and 11/24/21, did not have education verification on file.

General: Based on review of documentation, three (3) caregivers hired on 2/22/19, 11/24/21, and 10/25/21, did not have a TB documentation on file.

## 415 - CPR/First Aid Required Training

### Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, six (6) caregivers hired on 7/12/21, 8/20/21, 6/12/21, 7/14/21, 11/24/21, and 10/25/21, were not trained in first aid and CPR.

# 435 - Training Not In Compliance

## 922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 7/12/21, did not complete ix (6) hours of orientation training.

General: Based on observation, a light fixture was not shielded and did not shatterproof bulbs in the girls' restroom next to the three-year-olds' room.

### Findings:

General: Based on observation, two (2) brown, circular stains were on the ceiling in the two and three-year-olds' room.



690 - Sink **Not In Compliance** 

922 KAR 2:120. Section 12. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (3) A sink shall be:
- (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;
- (c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;
- (d) Equipped with liquid soap;
- (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;
- (f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and
- (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

### Findings:

General: Based on observation, no water flowed from the hot and cold faucets when turned to the on position at a sink in the boys' restroom next to the three-year-olds' room. Interview determined the sink was in need of repair. The hot water temperature registered seventy-eight (78) degrees Fahrenheit at a sink in the girls' restroom next to the threeyears-olds' room and at a sink in the restroom adjacent to the infants' room.

General: Based on review of documentation, four (4) children enrolled on 2/16/22, 1/25/22, 1/5/22, and 1/31/22, did not have the name of a person who was designated in writing to pick up the child in the enrollment information.
