Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:400E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

## Findings:

General: Based on observation, the following was found:

- 1. Staff with hire dates of 7/14/2020, 7/7/2020, and 6/25/2018, did not have proof of completing the "Requirements for reopening childcare" training.
- 2. A staff member in the infant room did not have her mask on properly. The mask was placed below her chin.
- 3. The nursery had a dirty toy container that was in the middle of the infant room floor accessible to the children.
- 4. All of the classrooms contained washable toys including cloth books, baby doll cloths and stuffed animals.
- 5. The surveyor witnessed children using the restroom without staff cleaning the bathroom after the child exited.
