General: Based on Observation, the childcare provider failed to maintain the health, safety and comfort of all children in care. Observation of a picture frame containing a stars certification revealed that the glass in the frame is broke with exposed sharp edges. Continued observation of the broken glass revealed that the glass is loose in the picture frame and poses a potential hazard to the children in care.

Observation of the bathroom on the right revealed a toilet plunger and a toilet brush that was accessible to the children in care.

Observation of the home revealed that a child placed her sippy cup on a table and another child picked up the sippy cup and took a drink from the cup.

Observation of the childcare home revealed that there were two (2) gas heaters that were covered with a metal guard. Continued observation of the metal guard revealed that there were sharp edges on the top where the metal was cut. Also, the metal guard on the top of the heater was hot to the touch and accessible to the children in care.
