the sixteen (16) children to the playground two minutes after the surveyor entered the room. The staff person remaining in the classroom continued to put cots out around the room. The remaining six (6) children were wandering around the room aimlessly. One child was observed eating several pieces of Chex-mix off the floor leftover from snack, one child was observed climbing on a shelf and another child kept trying to get out the door of the classroom. The staff person did not provide any toys or activities during this time and was not aware of the actions of the children in her care.

There was a metal two-drawer file cabinet in the Montessori A classroom that had an accumulation of rust. 3. A shelving unit in the Toddler Gym had a backing that was peeling away from the unit.
