General: Based on review of documentation, two (2) children enrolled on 8/24/20 and 9/8/20, each did not have an individual record that included a contact phone number for the person listed to be contacted in an emergency situation involving or impacting the child.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:410E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

#### Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the center failed to ensure all child care staff, directors, owners and operators complete a new, mandatory training on cleaning, sanitizing, health procedures, and mandatory reporting prior to the date of reopening, in accordance with 922 KAR 2:405E Section 9 (1). Five (5) caregivers hired on 12/31/19, 7/30/07, 8/1/19, 8/8/18, and 8/1/98, did not complete the mandatory training.
