Findings: General: Based on observation, the surveyor found one (1) electrical outlet with no protective covering in Classroom B.

(16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following: (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment; (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.	
Findings: General: Based on review of documentation and ECE - TRIS, the surveyor found the following: (1.) Staff (DOH: 12/13/16) obtained only six (6) of the required fifteen (15) hours of cabinet - approved early care and education training. (2.) Staff (DOH: 12/13/16) did not obtain the one and one - half (1 1/2) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training within their first year of employment.

First Aid and Medicine.****(6) Medication, including refrigerated medication, shall be:****(a) Stored in a separate and locked place, out of the reach of a child unless the medication is:****1. A first aid supply and is maintained in accordance with subsection (1) of this section;****2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child;****3. An epinephrine auto-injector. In accordance with KRS 199.8951:****a. An epinephrine auto-injector shall be inaccessible to a child;****b. A child-care center shall have at least one person onsite who has received training on the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector if the child-care center maintains an epinephrine auto-injector;****c. A child-care center shall seek emergency medical care for a child if an auto-injector is administered to the child; and****d. A child-care center shall report to the child's parent and the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 2:090, Section 12 if an epinephrine auto-injector is administered to a child; or****4. An emergency or rescue medication for a child in care, such as medication to respond to diabetic or asthmatic condition, as prescribed by the child's physician. Emergency or rescue medication shall be inaccessible to a child in care;****(b) Kept in the original bottle; and****(c) Properly labeled.****(7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the medication's expiration date has passed.****Findings:**

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found two (2) containers of diaper rash cream located in a cabinet under the diaper changing table. The cabinet door was partially opened exposing the diaper rash cream; therefore, the cream was accessible to the children. The diaper changing table is used by the Infant / Toddler Classroom and Classroom A.
