General: Based on review of documentation, it was found that one (1) staff did not have proof of education on file at the facility. The date of hire for this staff is 04/27/2018.

410 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the following was found:

- 1.) Four (4) staff did not have evidence of completing Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma training within the last five (5) years. The dates of hire for these staff are: 11/07/2007, 09/20/2010, 08/13/2012, and 02/06/2017.
- 2.) Two (2) staff did not have evidence of taking the required Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma training. The dates of hire for these staff are 08/21/2017 and 11/20/2017.
- 3.) One (1) staff did not have evidence of completing the required orientation training. The date of hire for this staff is 11/20/2017.
- 4.) Two (2) staff did not have evidence of completing the required fifteen (15) hours of cabinet approved training.

A review of ECE-TRIS confirmed these findings.

General: Based on observation, it was found that the lesson plans in both the afterschool classroom and the two (2) year old classroom were not current.

General: Based on observation, it was found that there was a coffee cup without a lid on the edge of the counter where the sink is located in the three (3) year old classroom.

580 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the following was found:

- 1.) There were stained ceiling tiles in the two (2) year old classroom. These stains were clear/white in color.
- 2.) In the three (3) year old classroom there were areas of chipped paint in the bathroom. as well as on the classroom wall under the "W" poster.
- 3.) There was a large area of crayon markings under the table by the art center in the three (3) year old classroom.
- 4.) There was a ceiling tile that was falling out of the ceiling in the school age classroom. This tile was located above the window looking out to the playground.
- 5.) There was missing/chipped paint in the four (4) and five (5) year old classroom. One of the areas was in the dramtic play area and the other was in the corner of the classroom by a shelf that was holding the CD player.
- 6.) There was a missing ceiling tile in the corner of the four (4) and five (5) year old classroom by the shelf where the CD player is located.

640 - Toilet Room Not In Compliance

- (2) A toilet room shall:
- (a) 1. Be provided for each gender; or
- 2. A plan shall be implemented to use the same toilet room at separate times;

General: Based on observation, it was found that the bathroom in the four (4) and five (5) year old classroom did not have any paper towels during the time of the walk through.
