Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The following was found:

- 1. The Two-year-old room contained nap mats that were stacked on top of each other. Based on staff interview, the mats are sanitized weekly. Nap mats should be sanitized daily if they are stored stacked on top of each other.
- 2. The Preschool 3's Room contained nap mats that were stacked on top of each other. Based on staff interview, the mats are sanitized every two weeks. Nap mats should be sanitized daily if they are stored stacked on top of each other.
- 3. The One-year-old Room contained nap mats that were stacked on top of each other. Based on staff interview, the mats are sanitized once a week. Nap mats should be sanitized daily if they are stored on top of each other.

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child care program;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.
- (17) A staff person's compliance with training requirements of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designated database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. A staff member hired on 6/17/2015, did not have a current pediatric abusive head trauma training certificate on file. The ECE-TRIS system indicated that the pediatric abuse head trauma training was taken on 9/22/22014. Pediatric abusive head trauma training shall be completed once every five years.

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The following was found:

- 1. The posted lesson plan in the Preschool 3's Room was outdated. The posted lesson plan was dated 2/01/2021 to 2/05/2021.
- 2. The posted lesson plan in the Preschool 4's Room was outdated. The posted lesson plan was dated 3/01/2021 to 3/05/2021.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The following was found:

- 1. The Preschool 3's Room contained two small holes in the drywall around the "Hall of Fun".
- 2. The One-Year-old Room contained holes in the drywall next to the sink.
- 3. The Preschool 4's Room contained holes in the drywall in front of the bathroom cleaning station.
- 4. The Preschool 4's Room contained holes in the drywall by the toilet.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The wooden fence on the playground used by the older children contained a missing plank and some broken wooden planks.

- (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and
- (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, this regulatory requirement was not met. The following was found:

- 1. The wooden gate on the playground used by the younger children contained a hinge that was not properly attached to the fence. The top section of the hinge contained some missing bolts.
- 2. The Preschool 3's Room contained dirt and grime on the front of the sink cabinet.
- 3. The School-age Room contained dirt and grime on the front and side of the sink cabinet. The side of the sink cabinet contained tape residue behind the trashcan. This was the sink located outside of the bathroom.
- 4. The School-Age Room contained a frayed carpet in front of the calendar wall. The carpet was frayed around the edges.
- 5. The School-Age Room contained a dirty step stool in front of the sink outside of the bathroom. The step stool contained dirty and grime on the surface.
