General: Based on Observation and interview, a caregiver's double shot energy drink, was on top of the sink in the infants' room. One (1) adult pair of scissors was placed in the pencil holder on top of the counter top in the preschool room. These items were accessible to children.

General: Based on Observation and interview, one (1), four-fluid-ounce bottle of Children's Allergy Plus Benadryl, one (1), four-fluid-ounce tube of DG baby A & D Diaper rash ointment and one (1), six-fluid-ounce can of Coppertone Kids sunscreen were not labeled to indicate for whom each was intended in the toddlers' room first aid kit.

The medication log in the infants' room did not have the name of the person who administered Benadryl on 08/15/18 and 08/29/18.
