Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:405E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the center failed to create and post a cleaning and sanitizing plan specific to the individual child care center or family child care home and outline the additional cleaning and sanitizing requirements from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for child care during a pandemic, in accordance to 922 KAR 2:405E. Section 6. The center did not have a cleaning and sanitizing plan on file. In addition, the center failed to assure all child care staff, directors, owners and operators complete a new, mandatory training on cleaning, sanitizing, health procedures, and mandatory reporting prior to the date of reopening, in accordance with 922 KAR 2:405E Section 9 (1). A staff member hired on 02/24/2017, did not complete the mandatory training.
