General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired 07/25/17, did not have education verification on file.

(14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
(a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

General: Based on review of documentation, and interview, two (2) caregivers hired 08/04/16 and 07/14/16, did not complete their one and one-half (1 1/2) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training within their first year of employment.

General: Based on observation, a caregiver did not wash her hands after she wiped a child's nose in the two-year-olds' room.

- (7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the expiration date on the bottle has passed.**

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a bottle of Albuterol was stored in an unlocked medication box in the infants' room. A bottle of ibuprofen, a bottle of acetamin elx., and a bottle of pain relief teething gel were not labeled to indicate whom each medication belonged and were stored in an unlocked medication box in the infants' room.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, an oval climber did not have a protective surface. Also, the two-year-old children were observed playing in pea gravel which was in a section on the two-year-olds' playground. Two (2), two-year-old boys played in the pea gravel with their hands and shovels.
