General: Based on Observation, a staff member's purse was on the floor in the toddlers' room. A can of glass cleaner and a can of shaving cream were stored in an unlock cabinet under the sink in the preschool room. A bottle of Mr. Clean Multi-purpose cleaner, a can of glass cleaner, a can of Glade air freshner, a can of Lysol disinfectant spray and a package of Equate antacid pain relief were stored on top of the paper towel dispenser in the restroom used by the school-age children. These items were accessible to children in care.
