General: Based on review of documentation, there was no written procedure to ensure compliance with, and inform staff of, the laws regarding reporting suspected abuse or neglect. The document provided for review was not specific and only indicated that abuse or neglect would be reported

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child care program;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.
- (17) A staff person's compliance with training requirements of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designated database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

# Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation presented and ECE-TRIS records, a staff person with a hire date of 7/1/1984, completed one and one half hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training on 1/9/2016. Staff person hired 7/1/1987, completed the same training on 1/16/2016. This training is required to be completed within the first year of employment and once every five years. Neither of the staff has updated this required training as required by this regulation.

### Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview at the time of the survey, a small area in the children's play space had been sectioned off with several baby gates in the form of a circle. A one-year-old child had been placed in this area. There were minimal toys available in the space for the child and did not provide a variety of creative activities. The posted planned program of activities did not address specific activities for the child. The staff person in charge stated this space was created for the child as their specific play area.

### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the children were seated at a table and in high chairs to eat their lunch at approximately 11:40 a.m. Each child was served the required components for lunch with the exception of milk. Cups of milk and a bottle were observed sitting on the counter. Some of the children asked for more servings of specific foods and still no milk was served. It was not until most of the children had finished eating before each child was served their milk.

### Findings

General: Based on observation, a one-year old child was placed in a high chair to eat lunch. The child's food was torn into small pieces and placed directly on the high chair tray. The child was observed picking up the bits of food with their fingers and placing the food in their mouth. The child was not provided with proper eating utensils or a plate or bowl to contain their food.

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, there was one child's enrollment information that did not contain parent contact information and the name and phone number of the child's physician. An interview with the staff person in charge found that the child is her grandson.

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the posted diagrams did not show the space used for child care. One diagram showed a layout of the provider's home with the front door labeled and the neighbor's home labeled. Another diagram showed a large square with the home's crawl space and the front door of the home labeled. These diagrams do not show the layout of the inside of the home and the rooms the children must go through to get out of the home. In addition, the diagram labeled Natural Disaster only provides a written plan in the event there is a tornado. There is not a written plan that addresses what should be done in the event there is an earthquake.
