Findings:

General: Based on Observation the child care center director failed to assure the health, safety and comfort of a child. Observation of the playground revealed there was an area located near the fence line that contained a concrete border, which dropped down into a dirt area. The concrete appeared jagged and had broken edges. The condition of the playground resulted in an injury to a five-year-old child resulting in scrapes to his knee.

Outdoor Play Area

690 - Playground Conditions

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (20) An outdoor play area shall be:**
 - (d) Safe from foreseeable hazard;**
 - (e) Well drained;**

Findings:

General: Based on Observation and interview with the director, the child care center failed to maintain an outdoor play area in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the playground revealed there was an area located near the fence line that contained a concrete border, which dropped down into a dirt area. The concrete appeared jagged and had broken edges. Continued observation revealed there was a metal stake protruding from the ground located at the edge of the concrete area leading to the grassy area, along with another metal stake near the Rubbermaid cabinet, therefore the outdoor play area was not maintained and in good repair and was not safe from foreseeable hazards. Interview with the director revealed she was aware of the issues.
