- 1. A small television was placed on top of a DVD player in the school-age area. The items were on a shelf that was approximately two to two and one-half (2 2 ½) feet tall. The television was easily moved and not secured; thus, presenting a safety risk to the children.
- 2. An electrical outlet was not covered located in the restroom that is used by the preschool children.

General: Based on review of documentation contained in ten (10) children's enrollment files, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. Five (5) files did not contain authorization by the parent for the childcare center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence.
- 2. Three (3) files did not contain information to enable a person in charge to identify or contact the preferred hospital.
- 3. One (1) file did not contain information to enable a person in charge to contact the preferred hospital.
