- (10) The minimum number of adult workers in a child-care center shall be sufficient to ensure that:
- (a) Minimum staff-to-child ratios in accordance with 922 KAR 2:120 are followed;
- (b) Each staff person under eighteen (18) years of age and each student trainee are under the direct supervision of a qualified staff person who meets the requirements of this section; and
- (c) Unless providing care with a qualified staff person, a person under the age of eighteen (18) shall not be counted as staff for the staff-to-child ratio.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to comply with staffing requirements. Review of staff files and additional documentation revealed there is currently a seventeen (17) year old minor that works at the child care center, and there was a seventeen (17) year old minor that previously worked at the child care center. Interviews with multiple sources revealed the aforementioned minors worked caring for children in group 3 with no adult supervision. Continued interviews revealed the minors cared for the children in group 3 with no adult supervision in the gym and on the outdoor playground. Further interviews revealed one (1) of the minors worked alone with the children with no adult supervision before 1/29/18.

General: Based on observation and interview, the child care center failed to comply with staffing requirements. Observation of the cafeteria at 4:00 PM, revealed fifty-six (56) children intermixed, not in defined groups. Interview with a staff member revealed the youngest age child in the intermixed group was six-year-old; therefore, the child care center was over maximum group size.

Interview with staff members revealed preschool age children were in attendance at the child care center on the day of the survey.

Findings

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of presented staff files revealed a staff member with the hire date 4/18/17 did not have a high school diploma, GED or Commonwealth Child Care Credential on file. Interview with the staff in charge revealed the aforementioned staff member did not have a high school diploma, GED or Commonwealth Child Care Credential on file.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of presented staff files revealed a staff member with the hire date 5/10/17 did not complete six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within ninety (90) days of employment. Review of presented staff files revealed a staff member with the hire date 6/4/14 did not present verification that fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training had been completed. Review of the ECE TRIS report verified the training hours were not recorded as completed. Interview with the staff in charge revealed she was not able to verify the training hours were completed.

Interview with a staff member revealed the aforementioned child was a preschool age child.

Observation of the cafeteria at 4:18 PM, revealed upon arrival for care a child's hands were not washed. Interview with a staff member revealed the aforementioned child was a preschool age child.

Observation of the cafeteria revealed children putting backpacks and materials on the tables. Continued observation revealed the surfaces of the aforementioned tables were not sanitized before children were served food on them for snack.
