Findings: General: Based on observation, it was found that there were two (2) uncovered electrical outlets throughout the facility. One was located in the four and five year old classroom, and the other in the three year old classroom.

Findings: General: Based on review of documentation, it was found that one staff did not have proof of education on file at the facility. This person's date of hire was 08/18/2018.	

410 - Training

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
 - (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
 - (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the following was found:

- 1.) One staff person hired on 03/27/2017 did not have documentation of any hours of annual training during the last full year of employment.
- 2.) Two staff did not complete the required fifteen (15) hours of cabinet approved training. The hire dates for these staff are 03/01/2008 and 11/01/2017.
- 3.) One staff person hired 11/01/2017 did not have documentation of completing the pediatric abusive head trauma training within the past five (5) years. The training certificate on file was dated 09/23/2013. A review of ECE-TRIS confirmed this information.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, it was found that the lesson plan was outdated in the four and five year old classroom, as well as the two year old classroom.

- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
 - (b) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids; and
 - (c) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, it was found that there were cleaning supplies under the sink in the kitchen. The door to the kitchen was not closed and locked; therefore these supplies were accessible to the children in care.

580 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the following was found:

- 1.) There was a hole/crack in the wall of the four and five year old classroom.
- 2.) There were areas of carpet that were stained in the four and five year old classroom.
- 3.) There was an orange stain on the carpet in the three year old classroom. This stain appeared to be made with a marker. In addition, there was also a black stain by the kidney shaped table in this classroom. In this classroom there was also a rug with a map design that was dirty and stained.
- 4.) In the three year old room there was an area of the baseboard that was stained with a pinkish-red colored substance.
- 5.) There were numerous areas under the window in the two year old classroom that had chipped paint.
- 6.) There was a hole in the wall located under the window that looks into the three year old room.
- 7.) There was a small area of the baseboard that was chipped off. This was located in close proximity to the area where the paint was chipped under the window.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the following was found:

- 1.) One (1) child's file did not contain his date of enrollment.
- 2.) Three (3) files did not contain a physician contact information. The dates of enrollment for these children are 08/13/2018, 08/28/2018, and the third date could not be determined.
- 3.) Two children's files did not contain a preferred hospital. One date of enrollment could not be determined, and the other date of enrollment is 08/13/2018.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, it was found that children's confidential information was posted in the two year old classroom. This information included the children's name and allergies. During the exit conference, the director reported that the parents wanted this information posted. However, there was no written permission from the parents of this.
