Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, there were mice droppings located in the kitchen floor between the milk refrigerator and the wire shelving unit. Staff confirmed that the center does have mice.

390 - Educational Requirements

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

(1) Child-care center staff:

(a) Hired after January 1, 2009, who have supervisory power over a minor and are not enrolled in secondary education, shall have a: 1. High school diploma:

- 2. GED or qualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity; or
- 3. Commonwealth Child Care Credential as described in 922 KAR 2:250;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the surveyor was presented with a staff file (DOH: 10/23/18) that did not contain documentation of education in the form of a high school diploma, GED, or Commonwealth Child Care Credential. The Director stated that the staff member is an owner that recently relocated to the area and proof of education had not yet been obtained for the file. The Director confirmed that the staff member does work in the center around the children.

395 - TB Verification

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

(1) Child-care center staff:

(b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:

. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or

2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the surveyor was presented with a staff file (DOH: 10/23/18) that did not contain documentation of a negative tuberculin skin test completed within the past two (2) years. The Director stated that the staff member is an owner who recently relocated to the area and the tuberculins skin test was completed on 11/12/18 but the results have not yet been read.

410 - Training

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

(16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following: (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 1/2) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, review of ECE-TRIS, and interview, the following were found:

1. Staff file (DOH: 3/25/08) for review contained documentation that Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma (PAHT) training was last completed on 5/6/13; therefore, PAHT had not been updated every five (5) years as required.

2. Staff file (DOH: 9/1/07) for review contained documentation that Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma (PAHT) training was last completed on 5/6/13; therefore, PAHT had not been updated every five (5) years as required.

3. Staff file (DOH: 3/1/08) for review contained documentation that Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma (PAHT) training was last completed on 11/12/13; therefore, PAHT had not been updated every five (5) years as required.

4. Staff file (DOH: 7/12/08) for review contained documentation that Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma (PAHT) training was last completed on 5/6/13; therefore, PAHT had not been updated every five (5) years as required.

5. Staff file (DOH: 10/23/17) for review contained documentation that Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma (PAHT) training was last completed on 5/6/13; therefore, PAHT had not been updated every five (5) years as required.

Review of ECE-TRIS, confirmed that the staff members had not updated PAHT training within five (5) years. The Director stated that she was not aware that the training had to be updated every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the surveyor found that the lesson plan posted in the One's Classroom was not current. The lesson plan was dated for 10/26/18 - 11/2/18. Staff stated she was not sure if there was an updated lesson plan for the One's Classroom.

(7) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:

- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
- (b) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids; and
- (c) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the surveyor found that there were drinks belonging to staff located on the half walls between the Three's & Four's and the Two's Classrooms. The drinks were in unlabeled containers; however, they were accessible to the children. The Director stated that she thought the drinks just had to be in unlabeled containers.

(a) Suitable for the purpose intended;

(b) Kept clean and in good repair;

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the following were found:

- 1. There were food crumbs located under the tables in the School Age Classroom.
- 2. The kitchen floor was soiled with food debri and dried red substance.
- 3. There was a soiled papertowel on the changing table in the Older One's Classroom.

Staff reported that the floors are cleaned and mopped daily. The Director stated that the dried red substance would have been spaghetti sauce from the previous day.

580 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the surveyor found that the paint was peeling from the walls in various locations around the School Age Classroom exposing the drywall. The Director was aware of the peeling paint.

(3) A sink shall be:

General: Based on observation and interview, the surveyor found that the water temperature at the sink in the Nursery did not get warm. Staff stated that the water only gets hot sometimes as a part is missing from the sink that regulates the water temperature.

There was not a fall zone equal to or greater than the height of the equipment on all four sides. The Director stated she did not realize that the equipment could not be pushed up against the wall.

General: Based on observation and interview, the surveyor found that two (2) razor scooters located on the playground were missing the handle bar grips exposing the sharp edges of the metal handle bars. The Director was not aware that the handle bar grips were missing.

General: Based on observation and interview, the surveyor found that there were two (2) accident/injury reports posted on the bulletin board in the Three's and Four's Classroom. The reports were posted so that the child's name and the details of the accident were accessible for anyone entering the classroom to view and read; therefore, compromising the confidentiality of the child. Staff acknowledged that the documents should not be posted in such a way that anyone could access or read them.
