General: Based on Observation, upon entering the facility, there were fifty (50) children receiving care in the facility. The facility's capacity is forty-nine (49). A review of attendance records and a separate check sheet kept by the director found that the check sheet for 2/28/17 indicated there were a total of sixty-six (66) children present in the facility during the day. The check sheet for 3/8/17 indicated there were a total of sixty-nine (69) children present in the facility during the day. The check list did not have arrival and departure times listed for each child on those days and the attendance records were not complete. Therefore, the records did not confirm or deny that the facility was over capacity on those days. In an interview with the Director it was stated that there are parents that work split-shifts and don't always pick up/drop off children at their designated times. The Director indicated that there are often times when the facility is over capacity.

General: Based on Review of Documentation, the facility's attendance records were not complete. On 2/28/17 there were thirty (30) children signed in at the facility and thirty-two (32) children signed out. On 3/8/17 there were thirty-six (36) children signed in at the facility and forty-four (44) children signed out. A separate check sheet is kept by the Director. The check sheet for 2/28/17 indicated there were a total of sixty-six (66) children present in the facility during the day. The check sheet for 3/8/17 indicated there were a total of sixty-nine (69) children present in the facility during the day. The check list did not have arrival and departure times listed for each child on those days.
