(3)(a) Each center shall maintain a child-care program that assures each child will be:

1. Provided with adequate supervision at all times by a qualified staff person who:

a. Ensures the child is within scope of vision and range of voice; or

b. For a school-age child, within scope of vision or range of voice;

Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation interview and observation, the facility failed to meet this regulatory requirement. On 8/21/13 an incident was reported to the DRCC office that occurred at the facility on 8/19/13 involving two (2) children (five (5) and six (6) years old) exiting the facility without adult supervision and walking to a preschool center located behind the school. Written statements obtained from staff that were present at the time of the incident and interviews that were conducted with staff during the investigation revealed that when a parent arrives to pick up their child from the facility the administrative staff person in the facility office notifies the child's teacher via walkie-talkie that the child's parent has arrived and then the teacher releases the child so that the child may walk inside the school to gather their personal belongings in the cafeteria area and then walk up the hallway to the facility office to their parent. This procedure does not meet the requirement of the regulation as the children are not always adequately supervised. Two children ages five (5) and six (6) year olds were able to leave the building on 8/19/13 and walk to a neighboring building without staff being aware of their whereabouts.
