Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found the following:

- (1.) Staff's (DOH: 2/23/18) file did not contain a high school diploma, GED, or Commonwealth Child Care Credential.
- (2.) Staff's (DOH: 4/2/18) file did not contain a high school diploma, GED, or Commonwealth Child Care Credential.

During interview, the director confirmed the documentation had not been obtained for the staff's file.

410 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and ECE - TRIS, the surveyor found that staff (DOH: 9/7/09) obtained six (6) of the required fifteen (15) hours of cabinet - approved early care and education training. During interview, the staff confirmed that fifteen (15) training hours had not been completed for the year.

- (21) A protective surface shall:

- (b) Have a fall zone equal to the height of the equipment.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- (1.) A large climbing structure with two (2) slides had an inadequate amount of mulch as a protective surface.
- (2.) A small Little Tikes climbing structure with a slide did not have a protective surface.

During interview, the director was aware of the issue stating the center has a plan in place to get new mulch for the playground.

- (1.) A child's (DOE: 5/22/18) file did not contain a preferred physician or a preferred hospital's telephone numbers.
- (2.) A child's (DOE: 6/27/17) file did not contain a preferred physician or a preferred hospital's telephone numbers.
- (3.) A child's (DOE: 4/3/18) file did not contain a preferred physician or a preferred hospital's telephone numbers.
- (4.) A child's (DOE: 3/8/18) file did not contain a preferred hospital's telephone number.
