(I) Assure the health, safety, and comfort of each child;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the B102 bathroom revealed a toilet plunger next to the toilet, accessible to children in care.

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulations. Review of staff files revealed three (3) staff members hired 2/5/19, 10/24/16 and 6/3/19 failed to have record of negative tuberculin result or a statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis on file. Interview with the staff in charge revealed this documentation was not on file at the time of survey.

410 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulations.

- 1) Review of staff files and ECE-TRIS report revealed documentation of fifteen (15) hours of cabinet approved training was not presented for review at the time of survey for twelve (12) staff members hired 2/23/15, 4/5/17, 8/6/12, 6/12/17, 12/22/14, 10/24/16, 9/7/10, 5/25/17, 8/27/12, 3/30/16, 2/4/13 and 10/24/16.
- 2) Continued review of staff files revealed two (2) staff members hired 10/26/16 and 2/4/13 had not received Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma training PAHT.
- 3) Review of staff files revealed four (4) staff members with hire dates of 10/24/16, 5/25/17, 4/29/19 and 10/24/16 had not completed state approved orientation training.

- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
- (b) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids; and
- (c) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulations. Observation of the B113 classroom revealed a bottle of bleach and a can of Comet labeled keep out of reach of children located in an unlocked cabinet under the classroom sink accessible to children.

540 - Premises Requirements Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (1) The premises shall be:
- (a) Suitable for the purpose intended;
- (b) Kept clean and in good repair;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulations.

- 1) Observation of the B116 classroom revealed several ceiling tiles had large circular brown stains indicative of water damage.
- 2) Continued observation revealed in the B107 classroom several ceiling tiles had large circular brown stains indicative of water damage and one ceiling tile was missing in the back of the classroom, exposing the insulation in the ceiling.

560 - Building Requirements Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (5) The building shall be constructed to ensure the:
- (a) Building is:
- 1. Dry;
- 2. Ventilated; and
- 3. Well lit, including clean light fixtures that are:
- a. In good repair in all areas; and
- b. Shielded or have shatter-proof bulbs installed; and
- (b) Following are protected:
- 1. Windows;
- 2. Doors;
- 3. Stoves;
- 4. Heaters:
- 5. Furnaces;
- 6. Pipes; and
- 7. Stairs.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulations.

- 1) Observation of the B112 classroom revealed three (3) full ceiling lights were not operational in the classroom.
- 2) Continued observation revealed in the B111 classroom several pipes on the classroom wall leading to the sink located next to the door that were not protected.

During interview, the staff in charge acknowledged the deficiency.

- 6. Free of any items not used for diaper changing.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain hygienic practices in accordance with regulations. Observation of the B102 classroom revealed the diaperchanging pad was torn, exposing the inner padding.

First Aid/Medication

730 - Medication Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 7. First Aid and Medicine.

- (6) Medication, including refrigerated medication, shall be:
- (a) Stored in a separate and locked place, out of the reach of a child unless the medication is:
- 1. A first aid supply and is maintained in accordance with subsection (1) of this section;
- 2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child;
- 3. An epinephrine auto-injector. A licensed child-care center shall comply with KRS 199.8951 and 311.646, including:
- a. An epinephrine auto-injector shall be inaccessible to a child;
- b. A child-care center shall have at least one (1) person onsite who has received training on the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector if the child-care center maintains an epinephrine auto-injector;
- c. A child-care center shall seek emergency medical care for a child if an auto-injector is administered to the child; and
- d. A child-care center shall report to the child's parent and the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 2:090, Section 12(1)(b) if an epinephrine auto-injector is administered to a child: or
- 4. An emergency or rescue medication for a child in care, such as medication to respond to diabetic or asthmatic condition, as prescribed by the child's physician. Emergency or rescue medication shall be inaccessible to a child in care;
- (b) Kept in the original bottle; and
- (c) Properly labeled.
- (7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the medication's expiration date has passed.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with regulations regarding first aid and/or medication. Observation of the B116 classroom revealed a tube of sunscreen stored on a desk that was not in a locked place and was accessible to children in care.

- (1) A child-care center shall maintain:
- (a) A current immunization certificate for each child in care within thirty (30) days of the child's enrollment, unless an attending physician or the child's parent objects to the immunization of the child pursuant to KRS 214.036;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulations. Review of children's files on 7/17/19 revealed the immunization certificate for a child enrolled 6/5/19 is no longer current as of 6/7/19.

Continued review of children's files revealed a child with enrollment date 12/16/18 failed to have an immunization certificate on file.


