General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 05/24/21, did not have education verification on file.

- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child-care program;

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver, hired 3/30/16, did not complete any training during a subsequent year of employment. A caregiver, hired 02/23/15, completed one and a half (1 1/2) training hours during a subsequent year of employment. A caregiver, hired 09/03/20, complete thirteen (13) training hours during a subsequent year of employment.

General: Based on observation, dark brown spots were on six (6) ceiling tiles in room B120, on four (4) ceiling tiles in room B116 and on three (3) ceiling times in room B102. Chipped paint was on the walls in room B120.

- (3) A sink shall be:
- (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;

General: Based on observation, the hot water temperature registered eighty (80) degrees Fahrenheit in room B120.

General: Based on observation, a caregiver did not wash her hands with liquid soap and warm running water after she diapered two (2) children in room B110.

General: Based on observation, five (5) crib sheets fit loosely on crib mattresses in room B107. The surface of (4) crib mattresses was ripped and foam was exposed in classroom B107.

General: Based on observation, a tear was in the hard plastic surface of a drum play apparatus on the three-year-olds' playground.

General: Based on review of documentation, a child enrolled on 05/26/20, had an immunization certificate on file that was valid until 06/03/20. A child enrolled on 02/25/20, had an immunization certificate on file that was valid until 03/23/21. A child enrolled on 09/28/20, had an immunization certificate on file that was valid until 03/23/21.

#### 1250 - Enrollment Information Not In Compliance

General: Based on review of documentation, a two (2) children enrolled 02/25/20 and 09/28/20, each did not have information on file for staff to contact the child's preferred hospital. Also a child enrolled on 08/25/20, did not have the allergy information listed on the enrollment form.
