- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

## Findinas

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Documentation of the completion of pediatric abusive head trauma (PAHT) training within the first year of employment, including once every five (5) years thereafter, was not presented for review at the time of survey for a staff member with a hire date of 8/09/95. In addition, the staff-in-charge acknowledged that the above-mentioned staff member's file did not include documentation that his/her PAHT training had been updated since 3/15/13.

#### Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulations. Review of ten (10) children's files revealed the written record for four (4) children with enrollments dates of 3/01/18, 3/08/18, 3/15/18 and 4/17/18 failed to contain contact information to enable a person in charge to contact each respective child's preferred hospital. In addition, the staff-in-charge acknowledged this documentation was not on file at the time of survey.

However, the attendance records for the date of survey revealed that eleven (11) children were signed in.
