- (j) Assess each staff person's interaction with children in care and classroom performance through an annual written performance evaluation;

General: Based on a review of documentation, staff member hired 1-4-16 did not have an annual performance evaluation on file.

- (14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

## Findings:

General: Based on a review of documentation, staff member hired 4-23-12 completed eleven (11) of training during the subsequent year of employment.

#### Findings

General: Based on observation, the black base boards were separated from the wall behind the door in the preschool room. In addition, the base boards were separated from the wall behind the door and the adjacent wall in the infant room.

585 - Sink Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (3) A sink shall be:
- (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;
- (c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;
- (d) Equipped with liquid soap;
- (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;
- (f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and
- (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, hand drying materials were not available in the hallway restroom. utilized by children.

590 - Toilet Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (4) Each toilet shall:
- (a) Be kept in clean condition;
- (b) Be kept in good repair;
- (c) Be in a lighted room; and
- (d) Have ventilation to outside air.

## Findings:

General: Based on observation, the exhaust fan in the hallway restroom was not operational.

(5) Staff shall:

- (a) Maintain personal cleanliness;
- (b) Conform to hygienic practices while on duty; and
- (c) Wash their hands with liquid soap and running water:
- 1. Upon arrival at the center;
- 2. After toileting or assisting a child in toileting;
- 3. Before and after diapering each child;
- 4. After wiping or blowing a child's or own nose;
- 5. After handling animals;
- 6. After caring for a sick child;
- 7. Before and after feeding a child or eating;
- 8. Before dispensing medication; and
- 9. If possible, before administering first aid.

## Findings:

General: Based on observation, a staff member hired 9-20-16, did not wash her hands prior to changing a child's diaper in the infant room.

- (f) Name of the medication.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, parent provided diaper rash creams and center provided sunscreen were applied with written permission from parents. No written administration records were completed by staff when diaper rash creams or sunscreen was used.

670 - Medication Not In Compliance

#### 922 KAR 2:120. Section 7. First Aid and Medicine.

- (6) Medication, including refrigerated medication, shall be:
- (a) Stored in a separate and locked place, out of the reach of a child;
- (b) Kept in the original bottle; and
- (c) Properly labeled.
- (7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the expiration date on the bottle has passed.

## Findings:

General: Based on observation, a 2oz tube of Boudreaux's Butt Paste and a 3.5oz tube of Aquaphore were an unsecured cabinet above the changing counter in the infant room. Also, two (2) .125oz tubes of Oralgel, unlabeled with the name of the owners, were stored on top of the locked medicine box in the infant room.
