Findings:

395 - TB Verification

General: Based on review of documentation, one (1) staff did not have proof of education on file. This staff was hired on 4/20/18.

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

(1) Child-care center staff:

- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, two (2) staff were missing negative TB documentation on file. These two (2) staff were both hired on 9/24/18.

400 - CPR/First Aid Coverage Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (3) For a child-care center licensed for infant, toddler, or preschool-age children, at least one (1) person on duty and present with the children shall be currently certified by a cabinet-approved training agency in the following skills:
- (a) Infant and child cardiopulmonary resuscitation; and
- (b) Infant and child first aid.
- (4) For a child-care center licensed for school-age children, at least one (1) person on duty and present with the children shall be currently certified by a cabinet-approved training agency in the following skills:
- (a) Adult cardiopulmonary resuscitation; and
- (b) First aid.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, neither of the van drivers, nor the van monitor that transports the children, had current CPR and first aid training. In addition, the facility did not have anyone with current CPR and first aid training during the hours of operation. The facility operates from 6:00 AM until 11:00 PM Monday through Friday.

410 - Training Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

Based on observation and review of documentation, (4) staff did not complete their fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during their completed training year. The following was found:

- 1. Staff hired on 10/23/12 completed 14 hours of training.
- 2. Staff hired on 8/15/09 completed 5.50 hours of training.
- 3. Staff hired on 4/01/15 completed 4 hours of training.
- 4. Staff hired on 10/25/10 completed 4.50 hours of training.

In addition, one (1) staff hired on 8/15/09 did not have a current (within the last five years) pediatric abusive head trauma training on file.

ECE-TRIS and the staff files were both reviewed.

415 - Driver Requirements

General: Based on review of documentation, the two (2) staff that drive the van that transports the children did not have current driver history records on file. These staff were hired on 8/15/09 and 10/25/10.

Findings

Based on observation, the following items were unclean or in disrepair:

- 1. The one-year-old room contained a missing section of baseboard between the area of the room with the tables and the main playroom (below the picture of the elephant on the wall).
- 2. The early two-year-old room contained two (2) cracked electrical outlet plate covers, one (1) was covered in clear tape, and the other was covered with paper and taped.
- 3. The early two-year-old room contained tape reside on the wall (in the first area of the room).

- (c) Have written policies and procedures, including emergency procedures practiced monthly by staff who transports children.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the facility did not have written documentation of drills conducted monthly for vehicle evacuation.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the 2012 Chevy Express G3500 used to transport the children had a vehicle inpsection that was no longer current. The inspection was dated 2/11/16 and expired 2/11/17.

General: Based on observation, there was no thermometer located in the milk chest refrigerator in the kitchen area. In addition, the small refrigerator used to store milk in the one-year-old room did not contain a thermometer.

- (a) A current immunization certificate for each child in care within thirty (30) days of the child's enrollment, unless an attending physician or the child's parent objects to the immunization of the child pursuant to KRS 214.036;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, two (2) children's files contained immunization certificates that were no longer current. The immunizations on file were both dated 12/01/18. Both children had been enrolled in excess of thirty (30) days.

- (b) A written record for each child:
- 1. Completed and signed by the child's parent;
- 2. Retained on file on the first day the child attends the child-care center; and
- 3. To contain:
- a. Identifying information about the child, which includes, at a minimum, the child's name, address, and date of birth;
- b. Contact information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's:
- (i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment;
- (ii) Family physician; and
- (iii) Preferred hospital;
- c. The name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child;
- d. The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable:
- (i) Allergies:
- (ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and
- (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;
- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, eight (8) of the ten (10) children's files reviewed did not contain the physician's contact phone number. In addition, one file did not contain the physician's name.

- (1) An animal shall not be allowed in the presence of a child in care:
- (a) Unless:
- 1. The animal is under the supervision and control of an adult;
- 2. Written parental consent has been obtained; and
- 3. The animal is certified as vaccinated against rabies; or
- (b) Except in accordance with subsection (3) of this section.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, a turtle was observed in the early two-year-old room. The staff in charge indicated that they did not have written permission from the parents for the children to be in the prescence of the turtle.
