# 400 - Educational Requirements

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (a) Hired after January 1, 2009, who have supervisory power over a minor and are not enrolled in secondary education, shall have a:
- 1. High school diploma:
- 2. GED or qualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity; or
- 3. Commonwealth Child Care Credential as described in 922 KAR 2:250;

## Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. A staff's (DOH: 09/17/21) file did not contain verification of a High School Diploma, GED or Commonwealth Child Care Credential.
- 2. A staff's (DOH: 11/15/19) file did not contain verification of a High School Diploma, GED or Commonwealth Child Care Credential.

435 - Training Not In Compliance

#### 922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child-care program;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1  $\frac{1}{2}$ ) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.
- (17) A staff person's compliance with training requirements of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designated database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

#### Findings:

General: Based on review of ECE-TRIS, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. The following staff (DOH: 03/01/02, 12/01/16, 09/01/18, 10/15/18 and 11/15/19) obtained zero (0) hours of the required fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training for the review period 07/01/20 06/30/21. During interview, staff-in-charge stated that the child-care center was closed during that time due to COVID.
- 2. A staff (DOH: 11/15/19) obtained zero (0) hours of the required one and one-half (1 1/2) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; therefore, the training was not completed within one (1) year of employment.
- 3. A staff (DOH: 11/15/19) obtained zero (0) hours of the required six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation training; therefore, the training was not completed within the first three (3) months of employment.

# 922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.

- (7) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:
- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
- (b) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids; and
- (c) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found a brown purse hanging on the wall next to a filing cabinet in Classroom 142. The brown purse was observed to be accessible to the children. During interview, staff stated that the brown purse belonged to a staff person.

## 585 - Premises Requirements Not In Compliance

## 922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (1) The premises shall be:
- (a) Suitable for the purpose intended;
- (b) Kept clean and in good repair;

### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. The first stall in the boys' restroom contained what appeared to be rust on the bottom of both stall walls; therefore, the stall walls were not kept in good repair. The bottom of one (1) of the stall walls was observed to be peeling/flaking.
- 2. The second stall in the boys' restroom contained what appeared to be rust on the bottom of the stall wall and was peeling/flaking; therefore, the stall wall was not kept in good repair.
- 3. What appeared to be a air unit attached to the bottom of the wall in the second stall of the girls' restroom that contained what appeared to be rust; therefore, the air unit was not kept in good repair.

# 625 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings Not In Compliance

# 922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

# Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found two (2) ceiling tiles located by the windows in the Fellowship Hall that appeared to contain water stains and appeared to be bulging; therefore, the ceiling tiles were not in good repair.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found an empty pack of Marlboros placed on a pink plastic play structure on the playground; therefore, the playground was not free from litter or rubbish.

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. A rake propped against the building near the front fence roll on the playground.
- 2. A maroon and gray play house that contained broken plastic at the bottom and middle part of the entrance into the playhouse exposing a sharp edge.

# 805 - Fence Construction Not In Compliance

## 922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(24) Fences shall be:

- (a) Constructed of safe material;
- (b) Stable; and
- (c) In good condition.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found a gap in the bottom of part of the fence roll located by a picnic table on the playground. Landscape pavers were observed to be placed in front of the fence roll; however, the gap was observed to still be accessible to the children.

- (13) An earthquake drill, shelter-in-place or lockdown drill, and tornado drill shall be:
- (a) Conducted during hours of operation at least quarterly; and
- (b) Documented.

### Findings

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. No documentation of a fire drill conducted during the month of March 2022. Through interview with staff-in-charge, the surveyor learned that written verification of the fire drill was not available for review.
- 2. No documentation of earthquake and tornado drills conducted during the first quarter of 2022 and no documentation of an earthquake drill conducted during the third quarter of 2021.
