- 1. Provided with adequate supervision at all times by a qualified staff person who:
- a. Ensures the child is within scope of vision and range of voice; or
- b. For a school-age child, within scope of vision or range of voice;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain adequate supervision in accordance with regulatory requirements. A staff member with hire date 7/6/14 left a child with enrollment date 3/2/17 alone in the Men's bathroom for about 2 minutes.

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 1/2) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of the presented employee files revealed staff members with hire dates 8/25/14 and 1/11/11 whose files did not contain documentation to verify the fifteen (15) hours of cabinet approved training had been completed. Review of the ECE-TRIS report verified that staff members did not complete the fifteen (15) hours of cabinet approved training. The director did not provide documentation to verify that the staff members had completed fifteen (15) hours of cabinet approved training. Continued review of the employee files revealed staff members with hire dates 2/1/17 and 4/10/17 whose files did not contain documentation to verify the six (6) hours of cabinet approved orientation. Review of the employee files revealed a staff member with hire date 12/2/12 whose file did not contain documentation to verify the one and one-half hours of pediatric abusive head trauma had been completed. The aforementioned staff member had previously completed the pediatric abusive head trauma on 12/2/12.

- (c) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids;
- (d) Plastic bags;
- (e) Litter and rubbish;
- (f) Bar soap; and
- (g) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

Findings

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. There was a plastic spray bottle labeled "bleach water" located on the changing table in the Women's bathroom making it accessible to children in care.

520 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. There were two (2) cracked floor tiles located by the tables in the Three-Four-Year-Old Room. The baseboard located by the toilet in the Men's bathroom was no longer attached to the wall.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. The blue vinyl couch located in the reading area in the Three-Four-Year-Old Room was torn exposing the absorbent material. The oven door was broken off the brown play kitchen set located in the dramatic play area in the Two-Year-Old Room. The drawer located under the microwave was broken off in the kitchen. The tray was missing out of the microwave located in the kitchen. The red plastic container labeled "blocks" located in the Pre-K Room was cracked exposing sharp plastic pieces.

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain food service in accordance with regulatory requirements. The mini-fridge located in the Infant Room had a thermometer reading of fifty (50) degrees Fahrenheit.

- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain children's records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Review of the presented children's records revealed children with enrollment dates 3/2/17, 8/16/16, 6/10/16 and 8/15/16 whose files did not contain the contact information for the family physician. Continued review of the presented children's records revealed a child with enrollment date 4/10/17 whose file did not contain the name of the family's preferred hospital. The director did not provide the documentation at the time of the survey.
