Findings:

General: Based on observation, and interview, the child care center failed to comply with regulations regarding programming.

Observation in the infant room revealed a two-month-old infant asleep in a swing.

Further observation in the infant room revealed a six-week-old infant asleep in a crib on top of a "Boppy" pillow.

Interview with the director revealed the two (2) aforementioned infants did not have a medical treatment plan from the physician requiring the infants to have an alternate sleep position.

- (3) Rest time shall include adequate space specified by the child's age as follows:

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to comply with regulations regarding programming. Observation in the infant room revealed a six-week-old infant asleep in a crib on top of a "Boppy" pillow.

Further observation revealed the infant had a loose fleece blanket on top of him from the chest down, and a pacifier with a multi-colored clip was in the crib.
