Inspection Type: Renewal Application

(3)(a) Each center shall maintain a child-care program that assures each child will be:

- 1. Provided with adequate supervision at all times by a qualified staff person who ensures the child is:
- a. Within scope of vision and range of voice; or
- b. For a school-age child, within scope of vision or range of voice;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the staff member supervising children in the School Age Room walked away from the area several times to answer the door. When answering the door, the staff member was observed to walk across the center, and through a set of double doors. This was not within the scope of sight or sound of the four (4) school age children who were present.

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the files for staff members with hire dates of 1/11/11 and 1/27/17 did not contain a current statement from a health professional that the individuals are free of active tuberculosis; or a copy of negative tuberculin results. The staff member in charge acknowledged that the documentation was not available at the time or the survey.



405 - Adequate Substitute(s) Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (6) Child-care centers shall have available in case of need:
- (a) One (1) qualified substitute staff person for a Type II child-care center; or
- (b) Two (2) qualified substitute staff persons for a Type I child-care center.
- (7) Each qualified substitute staff person shall:
- (a) Meet the staff requirements of this administrative regulation; and
- (b) Provide the required documentation to verify compliance with this administrative regulation.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the center did not have adequate substitutes on the day of the inspection. Of the two substitues that the staff member in charge identified, one was listed as a "volunteer" and the other was not available at the time of the inspection.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the daily planned program posted in the Infant Room, Two Year Old Room and Three through Five Year Old Room did not list a variety of creative activities that included: . Art or music, Math or numbers, Dramatic play, Stories and books, Science or nature, Block building or stacking, Tactile or sensory activity, Multicultural exposure, Indoor or outdoor play in which a child makes use of both small and large muscles, or balance of active and quiet play, including group and individual activity.

495 - Bedding/Toys in Crib

 (3) Rest time shall include adequate space specified by the child's age as follows:

- 3. No loose bedding, such as a bumper or a blanket; and
- 4. No toys or other items except the infant's pacifier;

Findings:

General: Based on observation of the Infant Room, all four cribs had loose-fitting sheets.

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

640 - Toilet Room

General: Based on observation, ceiling tiles were separated from their frames in the Infant Room and Two Year Old Room. Three peices of wooden wall trim in the "Extra Room" were splintered and in disrepair.

- (2) A toilet room shall:
- (a) 1. Be provided for each gender; or
- 2. A plan shall be implemented to use the same toilet room at separate times;
- (b) Have a supply of toilet paper; and
- (c) Be cleaned and disinfected daily.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, seven (7) two-year-old boys and girls were taken into the Women's restroom at the same time. The restroom did not have doors on the stalls, and the children were not separated by gender when using the restroom.



645 - Sink **Not In Compliance**

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (3) A sink shall be:
- (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;
- (c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;
- (d) Equipped with liquid soap;
- (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;
- (f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and
- (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, one sink in the women's restroom was not functioning; therefore it was not equipped with cold and warm running water that allowed for hand washing. Liquid soup was not available in the Men's Restroom. There was a soap dispenser sitting atop of the sink, but soap could not be accessed from it.

General: Based on observation, the changing pads in the Infant Room, One Year Old Room, and Women's Restroom were torn.

- (c) Be adequately ventilated to the outside air; and
- (d) Except in a Type II child-care center when a meal is not being prepared, not be used for the activity of a child.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the kitchen was not adequately ventilated to outside air.

1025 - Refrigerator **Not In Compliance**

922 KAR 2:120. Section 8. Kitchen Requirements.

- (4) A cold-storage facility used for storage of perishable food in a nonfrozen state shall:
- (a) Have an indicating thermometer or other appropriate temperature measuring device;
- (b) Be in a safe environment for preservation; and
- (c) Be forty (40) degrees Fahrenheit or below.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the mini refrigerator in the Infant Room did not contain a thermometer or other appropriate temperature-measuring device; therefore, the temperature of the mini refrigerator could not be determined.



1030 - Frozen Food Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 8. Kitchen Requirements.

- (5) Frozen food shall be:
- (a) Kept at a temperature of zero degrees Fahrenheit or below; and
- (b) Thawed:
- 1. At refrigerator temperatures;
- 2. Under cool, potable running water:
- 3. As part of the cooking process; or
- 4. By another method in accordance with the Department of Public Health's food safety standards and permits, established in KRS Chapter 217.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the temperature of the freezer in the kitchen measured ten (10) degrees.

- b. Contact information to enable a person in charge to contact the child's:
- (i) Parent at the parent's home or place of employment;
- (ii) Family physician; and
- (iii) Preferred hospital;
- c. The name of each person who is designated in writing to pick-up the child;
- d. The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable:
- (i) Allergies:
- (ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and
- (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;
- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency situation involving or impacting the child was not listed in the enrollment file for a child with an enrollment date of 8/20/20. The enrollment form for a child with an enrollment date of 1/21/19 did not contain a preferred hospital. The staff member in charge acknowledged this difficency.

- (a) The provider's preliminary or regular license;
- (b) Each statement of deficiency and civil penalty notice issued by the cabinet during the current licensure year;
- (c) Each plan of correction submitted by the child-care center to the cabinet during the current licensure year;
- (d) Information on the Kentucky Consumer Product Safety Program and the program's Website as specified in KRS 199.897;
- (e) A description of services provided by the child-care center, including:
- 1. Current rates for child care; and
- 2. Each service charged separately and in addition to the basic rate for child care;
- (f) Minimum staff-to-child ratios and group size established in 922 KAR 2:120; and
- (g) Daily planned program.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the current rates for the child care center were not posted in a conspicious place.

1255 - Emergency Regulation Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:405E. Emergency Regulation.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:405E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements specific to the current pandemic as established in 922 KAR 2:405E. Children from the Infant Room and One Year Old Room and staff members from the One Year Old Room and School Age Room were moved between classrooms after groups had been established for the day.
