922 KAR 2:110. Section 4. Director Requirements and Responsibilities.

- (1) Effective with the adoption of this administrative regulation, a director shall:
- (I) Provide for the health, safety, and comfort of each child;

## Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the child care center director failed to assure compliance with regulatory requirements. In the Infant Room, there were nine (9) infants ages three-months-old to eleven-months-old, and staff members revealed the room is also used by toddlers. A small space heater was sitting on the floor near a crib, accessible to children, and the heater vent was hot to the touch.

320 - TB Verification Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

#### Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulations. The tuberculin skin test presented for review at the time of survey for a staff member hired 5/31/11 was inconclusive as the document did not indicate the results of the skin test. The director revealed this was the only documentation available for review at the time of survey. The PPD Skin Test results presented for review at the time of survey for a staff member hired 6/14/17 were inconclusive as the results showed "4mm" of induration; however, the document did not indicate that the results were negative or that the individual is free of active tuberculosis. The director revealed this was the only documentation available for review at the time of survey. The tuberculin skin test presented for review at the time of survey for a staff member hired 10/31/17 was inconclusive as the results showed "6-8mm" of induration; however, the document did not indicate that the results were negative or that the individual is free of active tuberculosis. The director acknowledged this documentation was presented for review at the time of survey. The medical documentation presented for review at the time of survey for a staff member hired 3/30/15 was inconclusive as the document failed to clearly indicate that the individual is free of active tuberculosis. The director revealed this was the only documentation available for review at the time of survey.

## 922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1  $\frac{1}{2}$ ) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

### Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulations. The documentation of six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation which was presented for review at the time of survey for two (2) staff members hired 3/6/17 and 4/13/17 revealed the orientation was completed on 6/30/17 and 8/24/17, respectively; therefore, the staff members failed to complete the orientation within the first three (3) months of employment. The orientation documentation which was presented for review at the time of survey for one (1) staff member hired 6/6/17 did not include the staff member's name; therefore, the document was not sufficient to prove that the staff member had completed the orientation. The director acknowledged the document failed to include the staff member's name. The PAHT documentation presented for review at the time of survey for the director hired 4/2/11 revealed the PAHT was completed on 2/25/12, which is over five (5) years ago. The director revealed she was in the process of addressing the issue with her PAHT.

## Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulations. In the Preschool bathroom, the hallway bathroom near the lnfant Room, and the hallway bathroom near the kitchen, there was a dust buildup in the ceiling vents.

#### 500 - Building Requirements Not In Compliance

## 922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (5) The building shall be constructed to ensure the:
  - (a) Building is:
  - 1. Dry;
  - 2. Adequately heated;
  - 3. Ventilated: and
  - 4. Well lit, including clean light fixtures that are:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulations. In several classrooms, several bathrooms, and the hallways, there were several dead insects inside multiple ceiling light panels.

# 922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (4) Each toilet shall:
- (a) Be kept in clean condition;
- (b) Be kept in good repair;
- (c) Be in a lighted room; and
- (d) Have ventilation to outside air.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulations. In the Preschool bathroom, there was a substance which appeared to be urine inside the toilet bowl and sprinkled on the toilet seat. In the One-Year-Old bathroom, there was a buildup of a brownish substance inside the toilet bowl.
