Findings:

General: Based on observation, DRCC surveyor pulled up to the facility at 9:00am. DRCC surveyor noted that a female adult and a child also arrived at 9:00am. Upon entry to the facility the director was found in the infant and toddler area with one (1) infant and two (2) toddlers. There were also five (5) preschool children present in the preschool area. There were no other adults present upon entry to the facility. It was determined that the female adult who arrived at 9:00am was a teacher at the facility and had just arrived to take over the preschool classroom. DRCC surveyor reviewed the attendance records for that morning and noted that the first four (4) children arrived at 6:30am, the infant arrived at 7:15am and the other three (3) children arrived between 7:15am-7:30am. The director was over ratio from 7:15am to 9:00am.

General: Based on review of documentation, the copy of licensing regulations that were on file for staff were dated 09/09/14 which was not the most current copy.

- (I) Assure the health, safety, and comfort of each child;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the following was found:

- 1) An outlet in the preschool area was missing a safety cover.
- 2) The door to the kitchen was propped open and a preschool child went into the kitchen to talk to the cook. The child was in the kitchen for approximately thirty (30) seconds before a staff person got him from the kitchen.
- 3) The director was seen picking up the infant who was secured in a bouncy seat and carrying the bouncy seat over to the changing table area to change a toddler's diaper.

General: Based on review of documentation, staff hired on 07/11/11 and 08/18 did not have documentation on file from a health care professional stating they were free of active tuberculosis.

General: Based on observation, the following was found:

- 1) The floor around the diaper changing area was dirty with dust, dirt and food crumbs.
- 2) There were numerous food crumbs left under the table where the preschool children had eaten their breakfast.
- 3) There was broken concrete found at the front entrance to the facility.
- 4) There were several pieces of trash and paper found on the ground leading to the playground.

565 - 35 Square Feet per Child

(6) Exclusive of the kitchen, bathroom, hallway, and storage area, there shall be a minimum of thirty-five (35) square feet of space per child.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, upon arrival the director stated that she was downsizing the facility to include only the front section of the building and the back half was going to be living space for her family. She stated that she had emailed Frankfort and they were aware of the change she was going to make to the facility. She had the facility sectioned off into an infant and toddler area, a preschool area and a school age area. There was one (1) infant, two (2) toddlers and six (6) preschool children present at the time of the survey. DRCC surveyor measured the new space and found that the capacity for the infant/toddler space was three (3), the capacity for the preschool space would be five (5) and the capacity for the school age space would be four (4) children. At the time of the survey the preschool classroom was over capacity by one (1) child.

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, child enrolled on 04/09/18 did not have a current immunization record on file. An infant present at the time of the survey did not have an immunization record on file.

- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

Findings:

General: Based on interview, an infant was present at the time of the survey. There was no written enrollement documentation on file for the that child.
