Review of staff files found that a statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis or a copy of negative tuberculin results was not presented for review at the time of survey for one (1) staff member with a hire date of 9/17/2020.

Review of staff files found that documentation of current training by a cabinet approved training agency in Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and First Aid as required by state regulations was not presented or found in the Early Care and Education Training Records Information System for four (4) current employees with hire dates 6/11/2019, 2/21/2022, 10/04/2021, and 5/17/2021.
