### Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, one (1) caregiver supervised twelve (12) children with an infant child being the youngest in the group while the children were in the eating area at 9:20 a.m. on 02/05/2020. Surveyor observed one (1) caregiver standing in the hall by the front door and a second caregiver walked out of the kitchen and into the eating area. Interview revealed the caregiver in the eating area supervised these twelve (12) children alone for approximately two (2) minutes.

In addition, two (2) caregivers supervised twelve (12) children, grouped together with an infant being the youngest child in the group from 9:20 a.m. until a guardian arrived and left with two (2) children at 9:33 a.m.

During lunch time, one (1) caregiver supervised nine (9) children with an infant being the youngest in the group for approximately three (3) minutes, while one (1) caregiver took children to the restroom and one (1) caregiver prepared lunch.

General: Based on review of documentation, a child enrolled 08/22/19, and a child enrolled 01/30/18, did not have their preferred hospital information on file.

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, the written evacuation plan was not provided to the parent/guardian and the local emergency management when the plan was updated each year in accordance with KRS 199.895.
