- (5) An individual described in subsection (4) of this section shall:
- (a) Submit to background checks described in paragraph (b) of this subsection;
- (b) May be employed or work with a child on a probationary basis for up to ninety (90) calendar days, pending completion of a:
- 1. Child abuse or neglect check using the central registry in accordance with 922 KAR 1:470;
- 2. Criminal records check required by KRS 199.896(19);
- 3. Criminal records check for any previous state of residence if the person resided outside the state of Kentucky in the last five (5) years; and
- 4. An address check of the Sex Offender Registry; and

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver (hired on 05/12/14) did not have a criminal records check and child abuse/neglect check submitted timely.

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver (hired on 05/01/93) had TB documentation that was dated 03/2011. A caregiver (hired on 05/01/12) had TB documentation that was dated 03/10/12. A caregiver (hired on 01/21/14) had TB documentation that was dated 03/11/11.

325 - CPR/First Aid Coverage Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (3) For a child-care center licensed for infant, toddler, or preschool-age children, at least one (1) person on duty and present with the children shall be currently certified by a cabinet-approved training agency in the following skills:
 - (a) Infant and child cardiopulmonary resuscitation; and
 - (b) Infant and child first aid.
- (4) For a child-care center licensed for school-age children, at least one (1) person on duty and present with the children shall be currently certified by a cabinet-approved training agency in the following skills:
- (a) Adult cardiopulmonary resuscitation; and
- (b) First aid.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, there was no caregiver employed who was currently certified in first aid. The caregivers' first aid certification expired on 02/28/14.

Based on observation and review of documentation, no one present with the children was certified in CPR from 11:45 am to 11:50 am on 05/23/14.

Based on review of documentation and interviews, the only caregiver certified in CPR worked part-time from 9:00 am until 3:00 pm on Mondays, Tuesdays and Fridays; Therefore, no one was present with the children with current certification in CPR from 6:00 am until 9:00 am and from 3:00 pm to 6:00 pm on Mondays, Tuesdays and Fridays and from 6:00 am until 6:00 pm on Wednesdays and Thursdays. The other caregivers' CPR certification expired 02/28/14.

General: Based on observation, three (3) infants watched a doctor program on the television at 11:45 am on 05/23/14. The posted program of activities stated the children should be provided stimulation through soft toys, talking to them, playing with them, feedings and music.

360 - Electronic Viewing/Listening Devices

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 2. Child Care Services.

- (4) The child-care center shall provide a daily planned program:
- (d) That offers a variety of creative activities including the follwoing:
- 12. Use of electronic viewing and listening devices if the:
- a. Material is appropriate to the child using the equipment;
- b. Material does not include any violence, adult content viewing, or inappropriate language;
- viewing or individual listening is limited to two (2) hours per day;
- d. Viewing or listening is discussed with parents prior to viewing or listening; and
- e. Viewing or listening is designed as an educational tool.
- (5) A child who does not wish to use the electronic devices during the planned program shall be offered other appropriate activities.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a doctor program was on television in the infants' room on 05/23/14. The doctor program contained adult content; therefore, was not developmentally appropriate for infants.

395 - Electronic Viewing/Listening Planned Program

Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.

(1) Electronic viewing and listening devices shall only be used in the center as a part of the child's planned program of activity described Section 2(4) of this administrative regulation.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, three (3) infants watched a doctor program on television at 11:45 am on 05/23/14. The posted program of activities stated the children should be provided stimulation through soft toys, talking to them, playing with them, feedings and music; therefore, the doctor program was not a part of the planned activities.

Not In Compliance

- 922 KAR 2:120. Section 9. Food and Meal Requirements.
- (2) Food shall not be:
- (a) Used for reward;
- (b) Used for discipline;

450 - Appropriate Use of Food

- (c) Withheld until all other foods are consumed; or
- (d) Served while viewing electronic devices.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, two (2) infants viewed a program on TV while bottle feeding in the infants' room.

General: Based on observation, an infant sat in a crib while bottle feeding in the infants' room.
