Findings:

General: Based on Observation, and interview, the child care center failed to maintain food service in accordance with regulatory requirements. Based on observation, 76 preschool children were served 2% milk for lunch. Based on interview, children were served 2% milk for breakfast also. Per kitchen staff, the vendor was unable to supply lowfat/1% milk, and substituted with the 2% milk.
