General: Based on Review of Documentation and interview, a staff hired on 04/20/15, a staff hired on 03/27/96, a staff hired on 03/27/12, a staff hired on 03/27/13, a staff hired on 04/20/15, and a staff hired on 03/28/10, failed to complete fifteen (15) hours of cabinet approved training hours during their subsequent year of employment. Also, a staff hired on 10/31/86, completed six (6) hours of cabinet approved training during the subsequent year of employment.

- (7) Except in accordance with subsection (8) of this section, the following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:
- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
- (b) Knives and sharp objects;
- (c) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids;
- (d) Plastic bags;
- (e) Litter and rubbish;
- (f) Bar soap; and
- (g) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

#### Findings:

General: Based on Observation, a caregiver's purse was stored on the floor in the school-age room. A caregiver's purse and cellphone were stored on a ledge in the hallway adjacent to the dining room. A wadded up plastic bag was in the cup holder area of a lawn chair on the playground. A spray bottle filled with a soapy water solution and a spray bottle filled with a bleach water solution were stored in an unlocked compartment under the diapering station in the two year olds' room. All of these items were accessible to children.

#### Findings:

General: Based on Observation, cobwebs hung in the corner in the downstairs restroom. An accumulation of dust was on the vent in the upstairs restroom.

- (8) An opening to the outside shall be effectively protected against the entrance of vermin by:
  - (a) Self-closing doors:
- (b) Closed windows;

## Findings:

General: Based on Observation, two (2) windows were opened approximately four (4) inches and had torn screens; therefore, the windows were not effectively protected against the entrance of vermin in the school-age room. These windows were opened for two and a half (2 ½) hours.

# Findings:

General: Based on Observation and interview, a NuvaRing in an unopened foil pouch was not labeled to indicate to whom it belonged and was stored unlocked in the refrigerator adjacent to the one and two-year-olds' room. A small jar of prescribed nystatin cream and a bottle of children's liquid silapap were stored unlocked on a shelf in the one year olds' room.
