General: Based on observation, interview and review of documentation at the time of the survey, the following was found:

- 1. A planned program of activities was not posted. An interview with the staff person in charge found that a planned program of activities had not been completed for the current week.
- 2. There were four children present. An interview with the staff person in charge found that the children were ages two to five years old. This combining of children does not allow activities that are individualized and developmentally appropriate for each child served.

The missing components were not supplimented for the children's lunches.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:405E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

## Findings:

General: Based on observation, cloth dolls, a cloth, child-sized apron and a stuffed bear were observed in the dramatic play area. Machine washable toys are not permissible as specified in this emergency regulation.
